## **Highlights of Planning Commission (PC) Meeting**

*(Held June 3, 2014 - Complete minutes on file at City Hall)*

The 2040 Comprehensive Plan received a preliminary review. The PC will be responsible the creation of the plan. It was decided to address the Comp Plan creation process at the next meeting. The PC is seeking to begin the creation process earlier to avoid time constraints. The PC is also seeking greater public input in creating the 2040 Comp Plan.

There was review and discussion regarding a proposed lot line adjustment at 1081 Quixote Avenue North.

There was review and discussion regarding Outdoor Temporary Sales/Event Standards. The PC amended the standards to allow seasonal farm stands. There was consensus among the PC to present the amended standards for Council consideration.

PC members agreed that some recently passed ordinances were in need of attention due to lack of detail. The PC will be addressing these ordinances at future meetings.

A resident residing at 1109 Quixote Avenue North petitioned the CC to review conditions of an imposed court order.

There was review and discussion regarding amendments to Outdoor Temporary Sales/Event Standards. The CC moved to pass the suggested PC amendments.

There was discussion about parking in the restricted parking area.

The Director of Public Works provided an update on the Quixote Avenue Drainage Project.

The City Treasurer presented preliminary 2015 budget information. A workshop will be held in July to further discuss the 2015 budget.

Councilmember Glasgow reported the LSCVFPD had 52 total runs, 17 of which were in Lakeland. He presented two petitions from citizens regarding City water and City parks.

The CC moved to accept the recommendation of the Personnel Committee to approve a 3% wage increase for Water Operator I, effective May 28, 2014.

Councilmember Bednar reported installation of new playground equipment at Humphries Park is nearly complete. She recognized all the volunteers who contributed to the installation.

### **Election 2014**

2014 is an Election Year. The Primary Election will take place August 12, 2014, with the General Election held on November 14, 2014.

Lakeland will have positions of Mayor and two City Council members on the ballot. Filing period for City offices will open July 29, 2014 and closes at 5:00 p.m. on August 12, 2014.

### **New Voting Equipment**

The County's existing voting system is 15 years old, and is showing signs of wear and tear. The new voting system will be used for the first time in all polling places in Washington County for the 2014 Statewide Primary and Statewide General Election.

The new voting system will include 90 voting machines and 90 ballot boxes, and a counting machine for absentee ballots. The new equipment will offer a number of new features that improve service and efficiency, such as a larger LCD touchscreen display; a thermal printer; digital scanning; and an auto feed tray for absentee ballot counting.

“The new equipment is similar in design and function as our previous equipment and the voter experience will be very similar,” said Jennifer Wagenius, director of Property Records and Taxpayer Services. “Voters will select candidates by filling in an oval on a paper ballot, the ballot will be inserted into a vote tabulator that will digitally read the ovals that were marked, and the paper ballot can be used in any recounts that are necessary. “The paper ballot optical scan voting system has served our County and all of Minnesota well, and this new equipment is similar in design and function,” she said.

The assistive marking device will remain the same for voters needing assistance in marking their ballot.

### ***Exterior Storage***

Lakeland Code of Ordinances requires that ALL personal property - INCLUDING TRASH AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS - is to be stored within a building or fully screened so as to be concealed from view of neighboring streets and property.

Trash and recycling containers are to be removed from the edge of the roadway when pickup is complete.

Exterior storage of a single boat on a trailer, a single trailer 25 feet or less in length or a single recreational vehicle 45 feet or less in length, is permissible if stored in their rear yard within all applicable setback requirements from any property line and displaying current licensing.

## ***Public Safety***

### ***Is Your Address Visible?***

City Ordinance requires a display of house and/or building numbers at each site. The numbers should be not less than three inches in height in a contrasting color to the structure and placed to be easily and clearly seen from the street when approached from either direction.

### ***All Animals Must Be Leashed***

The Animal Control Officer can pick up dogs running at large. If the animal is licensed, every effort will be made to return the animal to its owner. If the animal is unlicensed, it will be taken to the St. Croix Animal Shelter and held until the owner has paid all City and shelter fees.

### ***Animal Licenses***

New Licenses are required for ALL DOGS AND CATS for the 2014-2015 Licensing Period

## ***Pet Owners***

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Be a courteous pet owner. Make sure you clean up after your dog when you are out walking in the City parks and along the street. Carry a plastic bag with you to pick up waste and take it home with you.

## ***Attn: Residents in the Restricted Parking Area***

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The area of the City between I-94 and Upper 5th Street North and CSAH 18 and the St. Croix River is a designated parking area where permits are required for residential street parking. Annual permits cost \$2 each, and five permits are allowed for each residence. Event permits are available for single-day parking and cost \$10. Permits may be obtained at City Hall.

# ***Public Works***

## ***Building Permits***

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The City contracts with the City of Bayport for building services. Inspections are made daily and will require 24-hour notice. To schedule an inspection, call (651) 436-1405 and leave a message.

Be sure to contact the Building Inspector PRIOR TO STARTING ANY BUILDING PROJECT to determine whether a permit will be required.

## ***Building Inspection***

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It's summer building construction season. It is often asked why building permits are required and for what projects they are required.

The City of Lakeland has adopted the MN State Building Code as a means to provide rules and guidance to construction-related activities. The City Building Inspector inspects certain criteria to determine whether the State Code has been followed. These

practices are put in place to make sure that contractors and homeowners are performing the construction or repair in a reasonable manner in accordance to the Building Code. Incorrect procedures or practices will not be allowed by the Building Inspector and will need to be corrected before the Inspector signs off on a particular project.

A significant number of projects require building permits. Projects such as new construction, fences, chair lifts, and sheds/garages (to name a few) also require other permits such as site plans, certified surveys, building plans, etc. The easiest way to know whether your project requires a permit(s) is to plan ahead and call the Building Inspector to find out.

The City of Lakeland contracts with the City of Bayport to provide building inspection services. John Buckley is our current Building Inspector. His office hours are from 8-10 am on Mondays and Thursdays at the water utility office located at 1190 St Croix Trail So. His phone number is 651-436-1405. Inspection times are limited due to the part-time nature of the Building Inspector position, and a 24-hour notice is required for any inspection so please plan accordingly. There are no inspections scheduled for Fridays.

## ***Curfew Hours for Minors***

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Curfew times for minors in or upon public places in the City are as follows:

- Under the ages of 16 years - between 10:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. the following day
- 16 or 17 years - between 12:00 midnight and 5:00 a.m. the following day

## ***Mowed Grass Doesn't Belong on the Street***

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The St. Croix River is on the Endangered Rivers List. Have you ever seen the River as green as St. Patrick's Day after a rain? You can help!

***Don't dump leaves of grass clippings on or near the road. When mowing your lawn, make sure the first two passes next to the street and driveway go back onto the lawn...and not onto the paved surface.***

Limit fertilizing. Consider installing a raingarden or buy a compost bin. One pound of phosphorous in runoff can result in 500 pounds of algae growth. Algae turn the River green, and it can use up all the oxygen that support the fish in the River. Fertilizers fun into the River, and seaweed thrives.

Even if you are not close to the River, runoff makes its way to the River. Installing a raingarden can reduce runoff going into the River by over 90%.

## ***Outdoor Implements***

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Any power lawn mower, snowblower, power hedge clipper, power saw or such other implement designed primarily for outdoor use shall be operated only between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on weekenday - or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and State and Federal holidays.

### Gateway Corridor Transit Project

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The hard work and collaborative effort of partners advocating for improved transit in the Gateway Corridor, from Saint Paul to Woodbury, was rewarded recently when President Barack Obama announced that 11 projects will receive expedited review and permitting. Gateway is one of them, and one of two Minnesota projects on the list.

Gateway Corridor transit would run between Union Depot in Saint Paul and Woodbury next to Interstate 94 and Hudson Road in a dedicated guideway. All-day transit service would stop at stations and include connections to the growing regional transit system. Light rail transit or bus rapid transit is being considered. The system could open for service by 2022 and will provide a focal point for new economic development opportunities as the region grows. The work is led by the Gateway Corridor Commission, which is comprised of local elected officials, business and community leaders.

Gateway Corridor planners are seeking input from residents and business people on what should be studied in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement phase.
